

Recognizing when it's time to replace your roof can prevent more serious issues down the line.

The most common signs of roof issues include missing or damaged shingles, leaks and water damage, and asphalt granules in your gutter system.

Missing or Damaged Shingles: Shingles that are cracked, curled, or missing can indicate that the roof needs repair or replacement.

Leaks and Water Damage: Stains on your ceiling or walls may suggest a leak. Persistent leaks can lead to significant structural damage if not addressed promptly.

Granules in Gutters: Excess granules (sometimes called "shingle sediment") in your gutters or downspouts indicate that your shingles are deteriorating.

THE IMPORTANCE OF COMPANY BRANDING

Reliable companies have an online presence, and carry their branding across the entire company. This includes:

Professional Website: These days, a website is a minimum business requirement. You need to be able to contact your roofer should something go wrong. A website should provide contact information, and be consistently branded with the company's vehicles, uniforms, etc.

Branded Vehicles, Uniforms, and Other Equipment: Roofers in an unmarked truck, without a company logo on their shirt, & who don't have company literature is likely someone who will do cheap work, and isn't easy to locate when it comes time for warranteed work.

QUALIFICATIONS AND CERTIFICATIONS

When evaluating roofing contractors, important aspects to consider are their qualifications and certifications.



Manufacturer Certifications: These certifications indicate that the contractor is trained to install specific brands of roofing materials correctly.

Professional Associations: Membership in professional associations, such as the National Roofing Contractors Association (NRCA), can be a sign of a reputable contractor.

CHECKING FOR INSURANCE AND LICENSING



Ensure that the contractor has the necessary licenses and insurance to perform the work. This includes:


General Liability Insurance: Protects you from potential damages or accidents that may occur during the roofing project.

Workers' Compensation Insurance: Covers medical costs if a worker is injured while working on your roof.

Valid Business License: Confirms that the contractor is legally authorized to operate in your area.

LABOR COSTS


The cost of labor for removing the old roof and installing the new one.

HOWTO COMPARE QUOTES



When comparing quotes, consider:

Total Cost: Don't just look at the bottom line. Evaluate what's included in each quote.

Scope of Work: Ensure that each quote outlines the same scope of work and materials to make an accurate comparison.

Payment Terms: Understand the payment schedule and terms to avoid potential disputes.

Owner's Reputation: A warranty is only as good as the name behind it. Do you know the owner's name & do they have any bankruptcies or collections against them?

THE IMPORTANCE OF A DETAILED CONTRACT



A well-written contract should include:

Detailed Scope of Work: Specific details about what work will be done and the materials used.

Payment Schedule: Clearly outlined payment terms, including any deposit requirements.

Project Timeline: Estimated start and completion dates for the project.

Warranty Information: Details about the warranties for both materials and labor.

KEY QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER

RED FLAGS TO WATCH FOR





Be cautious of contractors who fall into one or more of these categories:

Unusually Low Bids: Extremely low bids can be a sign of subpar materials or hidden costs.

Lack of Licensing or Insurance: Avoid contractors who cannot provide proof of licensing and insurance.

Pressure Tactics: Contractors who pressure you to make a quick decision or pay upfront should be avoided.

A Company with No Public

Image: Roofers without company logos & literature could be hiding something, or be one of the notorious contractors who change their name every few years. These tactics are a giant red flag.

ENSURING QUALITY AND COMPLIANCE



To protect your investment:

Verify the contractor's references and past work.

Confirm that all necessary permits are secured.

Ensure the contractor adheres to industry standards and best practices throughout the project.

TYPES OF WARRANTIES



Roofing warranties generally fall into two categories:

Manufacturer's Warranty: Covers defects in the roofing materials. This warranty varies by manufacturer and product.

Workmanship Warranty: Covers issues related to the installation of the roof. This warranty is provided by the contractor and can vary in length.

WHATIS COVERED COVERED



Roofing warranties generally fall into two categories:

Manufacturer's Warranties: Typically cover material defects. These can be issues such as premature aging or manufacturing defects.

Workmanship Warranties: Usually cover installation errors and problems caused by improper installation, such as leaks or premature failure.

HOW TO MAKEA WARRANTY CLAIM



To make a warranty claim:

Know Your Contractor: If you don't know who the owner is, they could offer a lifetime warranty and you'll never be able to enforce it.

Keep Documentation: Maintain records of the warranty, invoices, and any correspondence with the contractor or manufacturer.

Contact the Manufacturer or Contractor: Follow the specific process outlined in the warranty for submitting a claim.

Document the Issue: Provide evidence of the issue, such as photographs and written descriptions.


Check for any complaints or ratings.

During the installation process:
